Considerations for the week

Sometimes, we can be quitters or critics or difference-makers. Tell of times when you consider yourself to have been one (or more) of these. How do you think other people would describe you in those circumstances? If there is a difference in perspectives, consider why that may be.

Read <u>Chapter 4</u> paying particular attention to Nehemiah's prayers and words about God.

How do these prayers and statements of trust in God play a pivotal role in the chapter?

Call to mind times when living for God has been difficult. When are you most often discouraged? Inviting the Holy Spirit into your thoughts, carefully consider how Nehemiah could be an example for you of overcoming.
