In just 52 days, Nehemiah completed the wall. Look back over the first six chapters, paying particular attention to the leadership skills that are illustrated. How did Nehemiah lead?

Recall the leadership of someone whom you consider to have been a good leader. Also, consider times when you have led, perhaps in conjunction with another. Describe the commonalities you see with how Nehemiah led his people.

Those who lead often struggle with fear. Name some fears you have observed or experienced. Under what circumstances do fears cause the most difficulties? How can fear be a positive motivator? See Philippians 4:6-8, Isaiah 41:10, and Romans 8:15.

Several of Nehemiah's associates tried to deceive him. What are some ways to discern truth and keep from being led into error?

What are you working on with God?
