	Inclusion, v. 2. All who were able were included. Why?
	emiah 8 <i>Praise, v. 5-6.</i> Notice that the assembly began in praise to God. Why is it good to begin by worshipping God?
	<i>Instruction, v. 7-8.</i> Ezra read to the people from the Book of the Law. He and the Levites taught them, helping them to understand. Why did they need this, and how was it important?
	<b>Reaction, v. 9-10.</b> Explain the people's sorrow at the reading of scripture, including how it related to their prior spiritual condition. Tell about a time when you experienced similar feelings.
	<b>Understanding, v. 12.</b> What role does understanding play in our reaction to the Word of God? How does our understanding of scripture affect spiritual renewal?
	<i>Renewal, v. 13-17.</i> Notice the actions that resulted from the people's understanding. Consider the part our actions can play in completion of our renewal.
	<b>Strength.</b> Scripture was read communally. They listened together as they turned to God together. Explore the inter-relationship of repentance & renewal on the individual level and on the corporate level. Consider how they were strengthened in their time and how it happens in ours.
	<i>Joy.</i> Each day this week, take a moment to ponder that the joy of the Lord is your strength.
	Please use these considerations for personal reflection, small group discussions, and with friends and family.
	And Nehemiah, who was the governor, and Ezra the priest and scribe, and the Levites who taught the people said to all the people, "This day is holy to the LORD your God; do not mourn or weep." For all the people wept as they heard the words of the Law. Then he said to them, "Go your way. Eat the fat and drink sweet wine and send portions to anyone who has nothing ready, for this day is holy to our Lord. And do not be grieved, for the joy of the LORD is your strength."
