Hear God in creation.

Hear God in scripture.

Ask God to speak to us in difficult times.

Considerations for the week

The voice of God. A friend may share an encounter they had with God. It may be a familiar narrative. It may seem unlikely. Explore how we can work with one another to recognize the voice of God and come to know God better together. Recall a time when you may have heard the voice of God. How did you know whether it was God?

Law of the Lord, v.7-9. Of course, "the law" refers to biblical statutes but it can also include other scripture. See John 10:34 and 15:25 where Jesus refers to psalms as law; and Psalm 119:9-16, 33-40; 2 Timothy 3:15-16. Psalm 19 invites us to contemplate all God's written revelation as God speaks to us through it. What can help us enhance our understanding of God's law and integrate it into our lives?

Discernment, v.12-13. It is hard to see our own errors – especially those we choose to deny or discount or disregard. When are sins of omission also hidden faults? Explain the role of a close community of believers in helping individuals avoid self-deception.

The voice of nature, v.1-4. Many find the divine in the grandeur of nature. What is it about a majestic mountain or a serene sea that draws a soul to contemplation? Explore how this can also occur in mundane settings. Plan to pause this week amidst everyday nature in the city to seek and know the extraordinary God of Creation within a nook of ordinariness.

Please use these considerations for personal reflection, small group discussions, and with friends and family.
