## Considerations for the week

God's love is freely given and we receive it freely. It is vast . . . so vast that we remain fully enveloped in it while passing it on to others, as Jesus taught us. See [John 13:34](#); [1 John 4:7,11](#). How can we best demonstrate God's love for others, both individually and corporately?

Many attributes of God's love are mentioned in [Psalm 103](#), and it gives analogies to enrich our understanding. Which is most unfamiliar to you? Which has been most meaningful?

We can be diverted from our love for God by interests and endeavors and distractions and even by those who are dear to us. Consider how these may become momentary or fleeting loves – loves to which we devote ourselves, supplanting our love for God. What is their allure? Contemplate how we may re-order our desires and know again the blessings of God's love.

"In him we live and move and have our being." (Acts 17:28). In what circumstances do you typically express your gratitude to God? Consider how you might reshape your life rhythms to enhance your thankfulness.
